


Incredible Years Small Group

October 1, 2010 – June 30, 2019




The Pennsylvania Commission on Crime and Delinquency (PCCD) provided funds to support twelve **Incredible Years Small Group Therapy** providers in 2010-2019. The program was implemented in twelve counties: Adams, Allegheny, Bedford, Cambria, Chester, Cumberland, Dauphin, Delaware, Lackawanna, Lancaster, Washington, and Westmoreland.

Description of the Targeted Risk and Protective Factors for Youth:

- Poor Academic Performance
- Favorable Attitudes Towards Antisocial Behavior
- Peer Rewards for Antisocial Behavior
- Opportunities for Prosocial Involvement


Model Fidelity: The goal is to observe 20 percent of the sessions taught to assess model fidelity. For the Incredible Years, minimum fidelity is defined as having conducted at least 75 percent of the program as designed by the developer.



Why is **Model Fidelity** important?

Evidence Based programs are proven to get high quality outcomes for youth, families, and communities. However, these programs only predictably produce quality outcomes when they are implemented as they were designed by the researchers who developed them, with **fidelity to the model**.

Incredible Years Dina Small Group Outcomes



IYS Surveys: IYS Small Group surveys are completed by teachers or parents before the first and after the last sessions of the program. There were 831 youth out of 1115 served who completed pre/post measures; which is 75 percent of those that were served.
